## NOTES

**Note 1** Reserved for service courses offered by a school for which major in that school may not use credit toward degree.

**Note 2** Reserved for courses to be cross-listed with other schools and/or departments.

**Note 3** Reserved for Special Topics. THE CREDIT HOURS MUST BE SPECIFIED. The system of using the right hand digit of the course number to identify the credit hours is recommended.

**Note 4** Reserved for special programs. THE CREDIT HOURS MUST BE "TO BE ARRANGED." The credit hours for which a student registers will be determined when the student registers and enters the appropriate number of credit hours. Since the credit hours are variable, the meeting time must also be "TO BE ARRANGED." Individual sections of courses in this number range will not be listed individually on the term course offering.

- Courses numbered 4000-4999 are senior/graduate level and can be used as part of an undergraduate or graduate program.
- Courses numbered 1000-2999 cannot be used as part of a graduate program. Graduate students are restricted from registering for 1000-2999 level courses. Special permission must be obtained from the academic unit responsible for teaching the course.
- Individual programs may allow a reasonable number of 3000-level courses to be used for a Master's degree.
- Seniors with a grade point average of at least 2.7 may schedule 6000 level courses if permission from the academic unit has been granted.
